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“As a connecting point between the city and the northern and western suburbs the Horseshoe Bridge is by far the most favored gateway. From a geographical standpoint this is inevitable. Considerations of convenience and expedition are daily contributing to make it less capable of catering for the demands of traffic. Beaufort Street is unpopular because of the double tram-line, while Pier Street and Melbourne Road are out of the question on account of the railway level crossings. Horseshoe Bridge is further favored because of two exceptionally well made roads in William Street an Aberdeen Street, giving easy running to North Perth, West Perth and Leederville. With the completion of the double tram-line on the bridge the congestion danger, great as it is now, will be alarmingly intensified.
